other basic organic chemical manufacturing


methanol: antifreeze, solvent, fuel, feedstock for biodiesel





CONSTRUCTION OF PLANTS

DIRECT JOBS

Constructing two natural gas synthesis plants:

1,600 "construction of manufacturing plant jobs"

CONSTRUCTION OF PLANTS

629 indirect and induced jobs

These 629 jobs include accounting, hospital, mining, truck transportation, restaurant, retail, landscape, and many more jobs spurred by this economic activity.







Economic Impact: construction of plants



JOBS: CONSTRUCTION OF PLANTS

The direct, indirect, and induced jobs created by the construction of the plants accounts for 2,229 jobs, \$301.7 million in labor income, \$409.6 million in value added, and \$812 million in total economic output over the 30 months of construction completion.



MANUFACTURING/NAT GAS STAFFING - COMPLETION

DIRECT JOBS

Each plant will require:

- 125 natural gas synthesis manufacturing jobs
- 25 oil and gas well drilling and maintenance jobs
 - 300 total direct jobs

COMPLETION OF PLANTS

717 indirect and induced jobs

These 717 jobs include natural gas distribution, truck transportation, warehousing, restaurant, hospital, retail, rail transportation, pipeline transportation, legal service, and many more jobs spurred by this core manufacturing activity.








Economic Impact: manufacturing & OG jobs

JOBS: SUSTAINED MANUFACTURING ACTIVITY

The direct, indirect, and induced jobs created by the sustained manufacturing activity accounts for 1,017 jobs, \$119.1 million in labor income, \$185.7 million in value added, spurring \$524.5 million in total economic output, per year,





"Based on the results, it's clear that these projects would be transformative to northeast Pennsylvania, and the commonwealth as a whole. HOUSE BILL 1100

Pennsylvania-focused, production based tax incentive for methane gas manufacturing.

PASSED PA SENATE

39-11, February 4, 2020

CONCURRED IN PA HOUSE

157-35, February 4, 2020

VETOED BY GOVERNOR WOLF

March 27, 2020
